#### **Attendance News**

Whole school attendance is currently 90.3%

Attendance is very important to every child as it enables them to access their education and reach their full potential. The government guidance requires all children to be in school and to have an attendance of 96% and above to be achieving the best they can.

At Aspire we aim to have attendance above 85% for every child.

We would urge parents and carers to ensure their child attends school every day and all non-emergency appointments are booked outside of the school day. We understand that children can become ill but also ask parents and carers to consider if your child would in fact be able to attend school in the event of them having colds and coughs as this can be controlled with over the counter medicines in some instances.

Vomiting and Diarrhoea requires a 48 hour absence from school to ensure all tummy bugs have cleared and to prevent it spreading to other children and staff as much as we possibly can.

Any absences must be reported to the main school office either by phone call, answerphone or email.

All medical appointments require evidence to support them and to be authorised on the registers. Medical/ Hospital appointments should be given to the office in advance so the absence can be logged on the registers and staff made aware of the upcoming absence.
